1. Event Schedule

At 19:00, if boats are still racing and no boat has finished, then this *Heat* will be abandoned.

Sunday 21st July

09:15 Race Officer's briefing

09:30 Racing continues

16:30 No race to start after this time (Time is for First Warning for the first heat)

At 17:30, if boats are still racing and no boat has finished in A heat, then this *Race* will be abandoned

Prize giving as soon as possible after the last race is completed

2. Venue

BRS&PC are holding this event at West Kirby Sailing club on Sandy Lane, Wirral CH48 3HZ

3. Organising Authority

The organising authority for the event is the Model Yachting Association (MYA) and responsibility for the management of the event is delegated by the MYA to BRS&PC

4. Rules

The event will be governed by the current version of the following rules:

- Racing Rules of Sailing as changed by the RRS Appendix E
- Equipment Rules of Sailing
- MYA Regulations for the Organisation of National Championships
- MYA Standard Sailing Instructions amended to include umpires working with observers in accordance with addendum Q will apply when announced by the PRO
- The RYA Racing Charter
- International Marblehead Class Rules
- Heat Management System (HMS)

5. Entries & Eligibility

Entry is open to all MYA affiliated members and is also open to members of foreign clubs affiliated to a Delegated National Member of IRSA. The number of entries shall be limited to 84 by the provisions of the Heat Management System (HMS). Competitors will be notified of any necessary changes to sail numbers in the event of a clash.

Entry for all competitors opens from Monday 18th March 2019.

Entries shall be made before **the closing date for entries, 23.59hrs Friday 5th July 2019** as follows:

- Online, using the on-line entry system via the MYA website.
- By e-mail attaching a completed event entry form below.
- By post sending a copy of the form below.

After the closing date, late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the organising authority and may incur an additional late entry fee.

All entries will be listed on the Marblehead Class Website www.marbleheadsailing.wordpress.com as they are received along with any sail number clashes.

6. Entry Fees

The entry fee of £35 (or £50 if entering for both the M Nationals and 10R Nationals) shall be paid before the closing date for entries. The entry will only be valid once the entry fee has been received. The event entry includes one event meal for the competitor on the evening of Friday 19th July. Additional meal tickets are available at £7.50 each.

Anyone who pre-enters and does not turn up are still liable for their entry fee. Entries cancelled in writing at least two weeks prior to the closing date may have their entry fee returned less a £5 administration fee. There will be no refund after this date.

For foreign entries who are unable to use the BACS system, they should email Graham Elliott (see Section 5) for Paypal payment details.

7. Parking

Car parking is available on the street alongside and nearby the lake. No parking will be available for competitors at West Kirby Sailing Club or on the lake apron. There are no permanent parking facilities for Campervans at the club or on the surrounding roads, however camp sites are available locally see <https://www.visitwirral.com/>.

8. Lunch and Refreshments

Hot and cold drinks and food will be on sale in the club house. Competitors will be provided with the facility to make tea and coffee at no cost in the West Kirby SC clubhouse.

9. Toilet and changing facilities

Toilets, changing rooms and showers are available in the West Kirby SC clubhouse adjacent to the lake.

10. Registration

Registration will be open as per the Schedule. All boats must be registered with, and display a sail number issued by the relevant issuing authority, or the owner/competitors personal sail number.

The following shall be presented to the Race Committee at the time requested during the event:

- Owners should attend with a copy of their measurement certificate which will be checked at the event.
- If applicable, the owner/competitors valid personal sail number certificate
- Emergency Contact details if this has changed or not supplied when an entry was made.

If any of the above documents are not available at the event, but a competitor claims that they exist, the competitor shall sign a declaration to that effect and send a copy of the missing document to the Race Committee within seven days of the end of the event.

11. Measurement

The Race Committee may direct that boats in the event shall be check measured. Random spot checks may be conducted throughout the duration of the event.

12. Frequencies

Permitted frequencies are 27 MHz, 40 MHz and 2.4 GHz

For frequency bands other than 2.4GHz, a minimum of five (5) frequencies shall be stated on the entry form and be available at the event.

13. Lake side and Launching

The lake side is concrete, there are jetties available to launch and recover boats. Launch and recovery at the lakeside is not normally possible. The venue is a Marine Lake and filled during Spring Tides. Although high tides are not expected during the event, it is recommended that competitors have footwear suitable to launch in shallow water.

This is a salt water venue and a fresh water wash down facility will be available near to the launch site. It is recommended that competitors bring suitable protection for placing their equipment on a concrete hardstanding.

14. Scoring and Racing System

Scoring and Racing System shall be as per Rules section above.

15. Protests

The Race Officer reserves the right to use observers drawn from the competitors. A protest committee will be appointed by the Race Committee to hear any protests arising from the event and may comprise competitors not involved in the incident.

16. Competitors with Disabilities

Competitors that require any form of help or special requirements should, prior to entry, get in touch with the club contact given in Section 5 to check if the club is able to help with the provision of any such special requirements. The onus is on the competitor to establish whether the available facilities are adequate before deciding to enter the event.

17. Prizes and trophies

Prizes will be awarded with the quantity dependent upon the number of entries.

18. Accommodation.

There are several hotels from different chains (Travelodge, Premier Inn, Village Hotels, HI Express etc) within 5 miles of the club. There are also a number of suggestions on the Wirral information [website](#).

19. Additional Information.

An event meal and social will take place on the evening of Friday 19th July at West Kirby Sailing Club. This event will also be the social event and prize-giving for the 10R Nationals.
