

RG65 & IRSA 65 Traveller Series Rounds 1 & 2

Birkenhead Radio Sailing and Power Club (BRS&PC)

Saturday 31st July and Sunday 1st August 2021

The publication of this NoR and its contents is always subject to any restrictions or changes that may be required due to the imposition of Government Guidance or Regulations resulting from the Covid-19 pandemic. This may include further limiting of entries (early entries would have priority) or ultimately cancellation of the event were there to be restrictions which stop competitors from travelling to attend.

1. Event Schedule

2. Venue

This event will take place at Birkenhead Club and Lake, Gautby Road, Birkenhead, CH41 7DR

3. Organising Authority

The organising authority for the event is Birkenhead Radio Sailing & Power Club

4. Rules

The event will be governed by the current version of the following rules:

- Racing Rules of Sailing as changed by the RRS Appendix E
- MYA Standard Sailing Instructions
- The RYA Racing Charter
- RG65 Class Rules amended as follows:
*For this event, RG65 Class Rule 5.2.3 will be replaced with:
The boat could be equipped with up to 4 (four) sets of sails A, B, C and/or D indivisible, which each do not exceed 2250 cm² of total surface*
- Heat Management System (HMS) if used

5. Entries & Eligibility

The number of entries shall be limited by to 35. Entry is open to all MYA affiliated members and is also open to members of foreign clubs affiliated to a Delegated National Member of IRSA. Competitors will be notified of any necessary changes to sail numbers in the event of a clash.

Entry for all competitors opens on publication of this Notice of Race.

Entries shall be made before **the closing date for entries, 23:59hrs Thursday 29th July 2021** as follows:

- Online, using the on-line entry system on the BRS&PC website or using [this link](#).
- By post sending a completed copy of the form below.

After the closing date late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the organising authority and may incur an additional late entry fee.

All entries will be posted on the [Birkenhead Club Website](#) as they are received. Sail number clashes and changes will be separately communicated to the relevant entries.

6. Entry Fees

The entry fee will be £7 for each day (Round 1 and 2) and payable at registration when the exact fee would be appreciated. The entry fee includes free tea, coffee and bottled water on each day.

7. Parking

There is free parking on site and on the street for cars, but due to the narrow gate width and limited car spacing within the club compound, we would ask that any skippers with motor homes park outside of the club gates on Gautby Road. It may be necessary for some cars to park on Gautby Road if there are a large number of entries or the grassed areas soft through rain. For any questions on this and relevant security issues please contact us.

8. Lunch and Refreshments

Hot and cold drinks and a small selection of snacks will be on sale in the club house.

9. Toilet facilities

Toilets are available in the club house adjacent to the lake.

10. Registration

Registration will take place as per the schedule in Section 1

The following shall be presented to the Race Committee at the time requested during the event:

- All boats must be registered with, and display a sail number issued by their Class Registrar or their personal sail number.
- If applicable, the owner's valid personal sail number certificate
- Emergency Contact details if this has changed or was not supplied when an entry was made. If any of the above documents are not available at the event, but a competitor claims that they exist, the competitor shall sign a declaration to that effect and send a copy of the missing document to the Race Committee within seven days of the end of the event.

11. Measurement

The Race Committee may direct that boats in the event shall be check measured. Random spot checks may be conducted throughout the duration of the event. Competitors are reminded that the Class Rules state that up to 4 different Rigs may be used during any event.

12. Frequencies

Permitted frequencies are 27 MHz, 40 MHz and 2.4 GHz

For frequency bands other than 2.4GHz, a minimum of two (2) frequencies shall be stated on the entry form and be available at the event.

13. Lake side and Launching

Launching is available directly from the concrete path surrounding the lake.

14. Scoring and Racing System

The Racing System shall be as per Rules section above. Scoring for the event will either use HMS or potentially Sailwave for a single fleet event.

15. Protests

The Race Officer reserves the right to use observers drawn from the competitors. A protest committee will be appointed by the Race Committee to hear any protests arising from the event and may comprise competitors not involved in the incident.

16. Competitors with Disabilities

Competitors that require any form of help or special requirements should, prior to entry, get in touch with the club contact given in Section 5 to check if the club is able to help with the provision of any such special requirements. The onus is on the competitor to establish whether the available facilities are adequate before deciding to enter the event

17. Prizes and trophies

Prizes will be awarded; the quantity will be dependent upon the number of entries.

18. Accommodation.

There are several hotels from different chains (Travelodge, Premier Inn, Village Hotels, HI Express etc) within 5 miles of the club. There are also a number of suggestions on the Wirral information [website](#) or on the [BRS&PC website](#).

19. Risk Statement:

19.1 RRS 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone"

19.2 Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- e) The provision of a race management team, recovery boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- f) The provision of recovery boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any briefing held for the event.
